Lotterywest provides funding to not-for-profit organisations to deliver projects that support community wellbeing, inclusion, and participation across Western Australia.

Grants are available year-round through an open application process, with funding decisions based on alignment to community outcomes and project impact.

Project Positioning

For this funding pathway, the project should be positioned as:

- a community wellbeing asset
- an inclusive space supporting students, families, and the broader community
- a long-term infrastructure improvement
- a project that enhances participation, connection, and engagement

Avoid positioning the project as:

- internal school equipment only
- a curriculum-based resource
- a short-term or program-based initiative

Project Title

Creation of an Inclusive Outdoor Sensory and Wellbeing Space for Students and Community

Organisation Overview

Project Description

Community Need

There is an increasing need within Western Australian communities for inclusive environments that support wellbeing, connection, and positive engagement for young people.

Many students benefit from opportunities for sensory engagement, non-verbal expression, and emotional regulation. Traditional school environments do not always adequately support these needs.

This project addresses this need by creating a space that supports a wider range of needs, reduces barriers to participation, and enables meaningful engagement for all students.

The project also contributes to broader community wellbeing by enhancing a local environment that supports families and strengthens community connection.

Community Benefit

This project will deliver long-term benefits to the local community by creating a shared space that supports inclusion, wellbeing, and connection.

The space will:

- support students with diverse developmental and sensory needs
- provide opportunities for families and community members to engage in shared experiences
- strengthen social connection within the local community
- enhance the role of the school as a community hub

The installation will be used within the school environment and during community activities, contributing to a more inclusive and connected local area.

Outcomes

The project is expected to deliver the following outcomes:

- improved wellbeing and engagement for students
- increased inclusion and accessibility
- strengthened connections between students, families, and community
- increased participation in shared outdoor experiences
- a more inclusive and supportive local environment

Project Delivery

The project will involve:

- procurement of outdoor sensory infrastructure
- delivery and installation within the school grounds
- integration into daily use and community interaction

Installation will be carried out by a qualified contractor in accordance with site requirements.

Budget

Total Project Cost: \$15,030

Funding Requested: \$12,000

School Contribution: \$3,030

The funding request reflects a realistic and proportionate investment toward a project that delivers lasting social and community outcomes.

Sustainability

The installation is designed as a long-term addition to the school environment.

It is constructed from durable materials suitable for outdoor conditions and requires minimal maintenance. Its longevity ensures that it will continue to provide value to students, families, and the community over many years.

Evaluation

The success of the project will be evaluated through:

- observation of student engagement and participation
- feedback from staff, students, and families
- increased use of outdoor space
- improved inclusion and interaction

Evaluation will be ongoing and inform future planning.

Application Considerations
